

Palmers Law Limited Carbon Reduction Analysis and Plan 2023

Introduction

The purpose of this report is to confirm our existing carbon reduction measures, report on the reductions achieved from our activities, note the future plans for further reductions and provide a list of further potential opportunities.

The areas measured are the company's offices and its business operations including client service and staff related processes.

The 7 greenhouse gases are:

- the non-fluorinated gases:
- carbon dioxide (CO₂)
- methane (CH4)
- nitrous oxide (N2O)
- the fluorinated gases:
- hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs)
- perfluorocarbons (PFCs)
- sulphur hexafluoride (SF6)
- Nitrogen trifluoride (NF3)

The Company's annual energy usage is measured in kWh and is extracted from the relevant energy supplier invoicing.
